A Word from the Pastor

Dearly beloved in Christ,

Greetings to you in the most precious name of our Lord and saviour Jesus Christ.

This month, from 9th March 2011 onwards we will be entering into the lent season. It begins on Ash Wednesday, where we will have a call to repent and a time to meditate up on the cross of Jesus Christ. As we travel in our Spiritual journey, our focus should be upon the cross of our Lord and saviour Jesus. What does it mean to us?

Jesus died on the cross so that we could have redemption. The cross was a symbol of criminal condemnation but by the crucifixion of Jesus Christ this turned into a symbol of redemption, Salvation and Glory for him and his followers. Let us see some of the important aspects of the cross of our Lord and saviour Jesus Christ.

Firstly, St. Paul says, "we preach Christ crucified, a scandal for Jews and folly for gentiles" (1 Corinthians 1:23) in these words Paul expresses the spontaneous reaction of every man introduced to the

redeeming cross. Could salvation come to the Greco-Roman world by crucifixion? A punishment reserved only to the slaves, and it was a cruel death with disgrace. Could the salvation come from the Jews or from a dead body? Could salvation come from a condemned man? Thus the crucifixion was scandal to Greco-Roman world and to the Jews. But for the disciples it was God's way of salvation.

Secondly, mystery of the cross: Before the crucifixion, Jesus also (several times) declared that the son of man will be crucified. His disciples did not believe that till they encountered the resurrected Christ. Jesus alone affirmed that the cross was necessary, as part of obedience to the will of God. Jesus himself explained this to the disciples who were on the way to Emmaus, saying "Messiah had to suffer according to the scriptures"

Thirdly, The theological impact of the Cross: St. Paul states that Christ died for our sins according to the scripture (1 Corinthians 15:3). A basis for the theological reflection in which the wisdom

of God was found through the cross is to reconcile the world. "The power of God appeared through the weakness of man God allowed to condemn sin in the flesh" (Romans 8:3). By the blood of Jesus on the cross, God reconciled all things to himself" (Col 1:20). Thus he could overcome the old divisions caused by sin and establish peace and unity.

Lastly, The Cross, the symbol of glorification: In the Johannine thought, the cross is more than suffering and humiliation. The cross is already an anticipation of the glory of God. In the Johannine passion narratives, Jesus moved towards cross with majesty. He triumphantly 'gave up his spirit'.

Today the cross of our Lord Jesus is the inspiration for us to follow him as he said, "If a person wishes to come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me" (Matthew 16:24). According to St.Paul we must realize that we have been crucified along with Jesus. "As for me, I want never to boast of anything but the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, on which the world crucified for me, and I to the World" (Galatians 6:14). Our sincere prayers are that this could be each ones experience in this coming Lent Season.

Behind every successful man is a woman – this saying is very true in the life of Mr. Francis Sunderraj. I have known them for the past 4 decades and I always admired this couple because of Elizabeth, I am sure she is the one who inspired Mr. Sunderraj to look trim and nice on all occasions

To pay tribute to a departed soul, who I have known for so many years is a very difficult task. When one is alive we do not make an attempt to say "What a wonderful person you are!" if we did say, it would be considered as flattery. When I took pen and paper to start writing I couldn't do it because I felt that Elizabeth is not gone but asleep as Jesus told Jairus and Dr. Praveen in his tribute on the funeral day mentioned this and I put paper and pen down and couldn't proceed. I felt a vacuum inside me but I had to prepare a tribute as I had promised Parin, I would do it most willingly. But I got cold feet to talk extempore. I said a silent prayer and thought I would read out the tribute as I did not want to miss out on anything.

In 1975, we worshipped at Shambu's garage on Chinmaya Mission Road – just half a dozen families and shifted to Defence

Colony, a place provided by Campus Crusade for Christ. The Sunderraj's and I would occupy the last seat. Sarah, a small kid on Elizabeth's lap would keep smiling at me and also wink at me trying to show off the money that had to be dropped in the offertory bag. Her mischievous grin amused me. Elizabeth and I taught in VBS a place provided by Mrs. Brave. When Elizabeth was W.S.C.S president, I was the Sunday School Superintendent.

The Sunday's contributed a lot in cash and kind and their valuable time for the church. The first Lectern and the six chairs at the altar and Bible are their contribution. They were dedicated and very much involved in church activities.

The worship service held on the 24th October 2010 by the Senior Citizens was a blessed one. Mr. Sunderraj led the service, though he was a bit reluctant but agreed and conducted the service like a professional. Elizabeth in the skit was exceptional and you won't believe that our practice was over the phone which resulted in a big fat bill. I thought Elizabeth was blessed to see her husband and her grand daughter Susanna take part in the skit, before she passed away and both excelled in their participation. And I had the opportunity to give her a hug in the skit which I feel now, was a parting hug.

Elizabeth – A happy go lucky person, always cheerful, she would have prayer meetings at her place and entertain guests with open arms. This family has lost a loving wife, caring mother and mother-in-law and a doting grand mother and we Senior Citizens and the Social Concern Committee has lost a lovable person.

In conclusion "grieve, not as those who have no hope" and Heb 13:5 says "I will never leave you nor forsake you." Let us uphold Mr. Francis Sunderraj in our prayers.

PRISON MINISTRY REPORT OF I.M.C. FOR THE YEAR 2010-2011



We praise God that this year has been a fruitful year in the prison ministry of our church. Many souls have heard the word of God and many have repented and accepted Jesus as their Lord and Saviour. The doors of prisons are still open to us to preach and teach the Gospel to the hungry souls within the walls of these prisons and as long as we have freedom we will strive

on. All this was possible only through prayer for past 16 years. We meet regularly every Tuesday evening and pray especially for the prisoners.

Through this year we have been visiting the prisons at Bangalore Central, Tumkur, Kolar I and the Open Air Prison at Devanahalli.

Bangalore Central Prison is a regularly visited prison and we go there every third Saturday of the month. Volunteers from other churches as well as the medical team from the Karnataka Shubhasamachara Mandali also join along with us on our visits. Central prison has about 5,500 male inmates and 250 female inmates. They are both under-trials and convicted prisoners. In the women's prison, most of the women come and join along in the praise and worship times, soon after which the Word is preached. They are very receptive and open to the Word of God. It is such a joy to see them coming forward regularly when we enter the prison gates. They join in readily with the Kannada songs which are taught and are also counseled for various problems they face in regards to themselves and their families. Many New Testament, whole Bibles and song books of many languages have been distributed to them. There is a great demand for such material amongst the under trials. After many years of visits we praise God that many of them have become prayer warriors within the walls of that prison. They meet for prayer 5 times in a day! The proof of the Power of God and prayer also has become very vivid

with miracles happening and many of them being released due to lack of evidence! One lady prisoner by name Malika, known as “cyanide killer” killed 26 women devotees in the temples by mixing cyanide into the prasada and rob them of their ornaments. She has been awarded the death penalty for murder, has also heard the Gospel. She is illiterate and so a talking Bible has since been presented to her. She has been hearing the Word and expressed her repentance and accepted Christ as her personal Savior. Our God works in mighty ways. Many of the prisoners have read the whole Bible more than 3 to 4 times. In the men’s section, one convicted prisoner, Gopi, who has served 10 years, is now the official leader of the men’s church within the prison. He is very thorough with the scriptures that he can quote many of the scriptures by heart. Through the Prison Fellowship of India he was able to, by God’s grace, find a suitable life partner for himself, when he was released on parole. Like Gopi, there are many who have accepted the Lord, and have shown a change in their life are now waiting for their release orders to pan out. We urge you to remember these men in your prayers.

The Prisons outside Bangalore (i.e. Kolar, Tumkur, Devanahalli Open Air) are visited once in 2 or 3 months. Faces change very regularly in these prisons with inmates being released and a new batch filtering in. This is a blessing in disguise because many new souls get to hear the Word of God and are saved in turn! We praise God that another door has been opened to us at the Chikbalapur Prison. God is active and is on His throne.

We were able to visit the families of a few prisoners to pray with them and share the Gospel. We have supported some of their children in their education.

We thank our church for releasing the Rs. 20,000/- towards Christmas gifts to all the prisoners during the Christmas and New Year seasons. All this is done to express the love of Christ to these people, to tell them that they are not forgotten and that they are valued in the Kingdom. The prisoners very much enjoyed the attention and the gifts distributed. We also thank the prison authorities for their favor in allowing us to hold these medical camps and share the Gospel.

There is still a great need for people to be available to come along, pray and counsel the prisoners and to share the Word of God.

THE GENERAL RULES OF THE METHODIST CHURCH IN INDIA

THE NATURE, DESIGN AND GENERAL RULES OF OUR UNITED SOCIETY

In the latter end of the year 1739 eight or ten persons who appeared to be deeply convicted of sin, and earnestly groaning for redemption, came to Mr. Wesley in London. They desired, that he would spend some time with them in prayer, and advise them how to flee from the wrath to come, which they saw continually hanging over their heads. That he might have more time for this great work, he appointed a day when they might all come together, which from thenceforward they did every week, namely, on Thursday in the evening. To these, and as many more as desired to join with them (for their number increased daily), he gave those advices from time to time which he judged most needful for them, and they always concluded their meeting with prayer suited to their several necessities.

This was the rise of United Society, first in Europe, and then in America. Such a society is no other than “a company of men having the form and seeking the power of godliness, united in order to pray together: to receive the word of exhortation, and to watch over one another in love, that they may help each other to work out their salvation.”

The society met and framed a set of rules for its spiritual formation and up keeping. They are:

FIRST: By doing no harm; by avoiding evil of every kind, especially that which is most generally practiced, such as:

The taking of the name of God in vain.

The profaning of the day of the Lord, either by doing ordinary work therein or by buying or selling.

Drunkenness, buying or selling spirituous liquors, or drinking them, unless in cases of extreme necessity.

The buying or selling of men, women, and children with an intention to enslave them.

Fighting, quarrelling, brawling, brother going to law with brother; returning evil for evil, or railing for railing; the using, of many words in buying or selling.

The buying or selling goods that have not paid the duty.

The giving or taking of things on usury-that is, unlawful interest.

Uncharitable or unprofitable conversation; particularly speaking evil of magistrates or ministers.

Doing to others as we would not they should do unto us.

Doing what we know is not for the glory of God, as:

The putting on of gold and costly apparel.

The taking of such diversions as cannot be used in the name of the Lord, Jesus.

The singing of those songs, or reading those books,
Which do not tend to the knowledge or love of God.

Softness and needless self-indulgence.

Laying up treasure upon earth.

Borrowing without a probability of paying; or taking, up goods without a probability of paying for them.

It is expected of all who continue in these societies that they shall continue to evidence their desire of salvation.

SECOND: By doing good; by being in every kind merciful after their power; as they have opportunity, doing good of every possible sort, and, as far as possible, to all men.

To their bodies, of the ability which God gives, by giving food to the hungry, by clothing the naked, by visiting or helping them that are sick or in prison.

To their souls, by instructing, reproving, or exhorting all we have any interaction with; trampling under foot that enthusiastic doctrine, that "we, are not to do good unless our hearts be free to it."

By doing good, especially to them that are of the household of faith or groaning so to be; employing them preferably to others; buying one of another; helping each other in business; and so much the more because the world will love its own and them only.

By all possible diligence and frugality, that the gospel be not blamed.

By running with patience the race that is set before them, denying themselves, and taking up their cross daily; submitting to bear the reproach of Christ, to be as the filth and offscouring of the world; and looking that men should say all manner of evil of them falsely, for the Lord's sake.

It is 'expected' of all who desire to continue in these societies that they shall continue to evidence their desire of salvation.

THIRD: By attending upon all ordinances of God; such are:

The public worship of God.

The ministry of the Word either read or expounded.

The Supper of the Lord.

Family and private prayer.

Searching the Scriptures.

Fasting or abstinence.

These are the General Rules of our societies; all of which we are taught of God to observe, even in his written Word, which is only rule and the sufficient rule, both of our faith and practice. And all these we know his Spirit writes on truly awakened hearts. If there be any among us who observes them not, who habitually breaks any of them, let it be known unto them who watch over that soul as they who must give an account. We will admonish him of the error of his ways. We will bear with him for a season. But, if then he repent not, he hath no more place among us. We have delivered our own souls.
