## A Word from the Pastor

*Dearly beloved,*

Greetings to you in the matchless name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

We are entering into the season of thanksgiving. Throughout this month, we will be meditating on the same. May this season of thanksgiving bring a healing in your spiritual growth.

Paul in 1 Thess. 5:18 says, "In everything give thanks, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you". It is said that practicing thanksgiving is therapeutic. When we say from the bottom of our hearts, "Thanks for everything", we are on the way to being happy, healthy people.

One day, a pessimist finds himself constantly bothered by things. His health begins to fail, the world is in a terrible state and his business begins to fall apart. He would always complain about himself and the circumstances surrounding him. But after a few days, people notice that he has begun to change. He is more vibrant and enthusiastic than before. When asked to explain the marked change, he replied,

"Its good therapy to give thanks". Every night in bed, he had begun to think of all the good things that happened to him that day instead of the bad. He began to pray to the Lord, "Thanks for everything", turn out the lights, and peacefully go to sleep.

Based on the scripture 1 Thess. 5:18, let us look at how thanksgiving benefits us.

### **I. Thanksgiving encourages a grateful spirit**

Paul emphatically asserts that the will of God is for you to have a grateful spirit-that "in everything (you) give thanks". A grateful spirit makes a person happier and makes life better. Let us think of a few things for which we can be grateful.

- a) Daily bread (Acts 27:35).
- b) Christian friends (Rom 8:1).
- c) Deliverance from anxiety and worry (2 Cor 2:14).
- d) Victory over temptation (Rom 7:24-25).
- e) The unspeakable gift of Christ (2 Cor 9:15).

A Pastor tells a story of a man on the verge of a nervous breakdown. He was an empty shell.

Someone suggested that he could avoid further damage by practicing the therapy of thanksgiving. First, he was told to make a list of everyone who had helped him throughout the years. Second, he was told to fill his mind with thanksgiving for all the things that these people had done for him. Third, he was asked to write a letter of thanks to one person who had especially blessed his life. He thought of his school teacher who was very old. He wrote to her and expressed how much he loved her and appreciated her for all the contributions she had made in his life. A few days later, he received a reply. The teacher, addressing him by his pet name replied, "As far as I can recall, among all the children that I have taught over the years, you are the only one who wrote to me and thanked me. You have made me so happy". This thrilled the man so much that he began writing letters to everyone on his list. Over the next few months, he had become a changed man.

## **II. Thanksgiving develops a positive attitude**

In 1 Thess. 5:18, Paul says that in spite of all that may happen, continue to thank God in all circumstances. In times of happiness, 'Praise be to the Lord'. In times of sorrow, his assurance that 'Lo, I am with you always' is with us. In times of failure, his words 'I have overcome the world' gives us confidence. When we walk alone, his protection is available to us. "The Lord will go before you, the God of Israel will be your rear guard" (Isaiah 52:12b).

As we celebrate the month of thanksgiving, May the Lord bless us and our dear ones and enable us to be a people of 'Thanksgiving' for the gift of life and Salvation that he has given us.

Through your exemplary life, may you bring others to Christ.

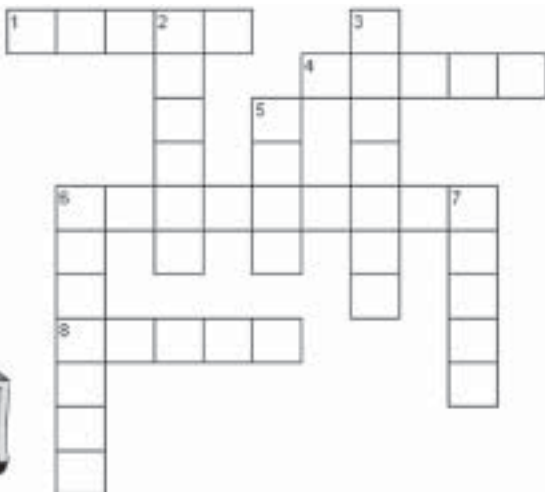

# Preacher's Biography

**ALEXANDER MURDOCH MACKAY**

*(Continued from the last issue)*



Mwanga was driven from his throne by a revolt in the autumn of 1888. There was little change when Kiwewa succeeded to the throne. Mackay still held on, however, and it is largely due to his courage, energy, and devotion that the mission in Uganda continued.

In September, 1889, Stanley visited Mackay on his return to the coast, and "In Darkest Africa" he gave with unstinted praise an account of the mission station, with its clay-built house

garnished with missionary pictures, and shelves filled with choice, useful books, its hospitable table with wholesome food (home-made bread and coffee); the mission-school of neat, well-mannered boys, a launch's boiler, and a canoe under construction, saw-pits, and cattle-fold, all the work of "the best missionary since Livingstone".

Stanley and his party urged Mackay to join the homeward expedition, but with characteristic fidelity he refused to leave until someone came to take his place. But on Feb. 8, 1890, he fell a victim to malarial fever, and succumbed after four days of illness, the last survivor of the little band that set out for Uganda in 1876. The last message from him, which reached the Church Missionary Society House ten days later, contains this clarion call— "You sons of England, here is the field for your energies. Bring with you your highest education, and your greatest talents. You will find scope for the exercise of them all. You men of God, who have resolved to devote your lives to the cure of souls of men, here is the proper field for you!"

For fourteen years without once having visited his native country, Mackay had given his utmost to the building of a highway for the gospel and in *preparing a way for the coming of his Lord* in Africa. After years of exile and heroic service, at his Master's bidding, his tireless energy rested, and the title-deeds of his labor were recorded, in divine Presence, upon the brow of every converted black in Uganda.

# 'RETREAT TO BE RENEWED'

I want to thank and praise God Almighty for making this camp everything it was!

The annual **youth camp** was held at AVALANCHE, an adventure campsite, 30 kms from Ooty, A four day, three night camp filled with activities, fun, fellowship and learning from the Word. It took us through a journey of being able to unwind and yet was an eye opener to many a thing. A different experience altogether. Leaving IMC on the 28<sup>th</sup> of Oct 2010 began a journey that was truly enriching, encouraging and adventurous. Traveling a night by bus, shifting on to a truck on our arrival at Ooty, trekking for two hours before reaching the campsite, residing in tents and huts in the midst of a forest, setting up camp fires to keep ourselves warm, enjoying the chillness of a waterfall close by, a swim in the lake, walking through pine forests, waking up to the sight of surrounding mountains – **truly quite different!**



Based on our theme for the year derived from Romans 12:9 – Do not be conformed to the pattern of this world but be transformed by the renewing of your mind – we set our camp theme as *'Retreat to be Renewed'*. **Mr. George Ebenezer** took us through a couple of sessions on what our identity in Christ is, positional truths – I am a child of God, I've been bought with a price, There is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, there is nothing that can separate me from the love of God. In his later session he continued to remind us of how we should guard our hearts from – people, disappointments/discouragements and idols, concluding with a verse Psalm 119:9 - *'How can a young man keep his way pure, by keeping it according to your word'*.

Focusing on relationships, **John and Suhasini** took sessions separately for the guys and girls. In John's session with the boys *'Used, abused and confused'* he helped them explore a concept called 'the dark room of sin' and how beneficial it was to live life in transparency. In Suhasini's session with the girls *'The Joys of being a woman'* she helped us in understanding our role as women, different love languages and how important decisions that we make are.

**Rev. Paul Royappa** shared with us the true meaning of *'Growing in Love'*. He continued on relationships, pointing out that a practical relationship with God is first tested in the battlefield of the family. He reminded us that to love God is to love parents.

Though the weather on our arrival was not what we expected, God in His faithfulness worked out everything to PERFECTION. Our sessions ran through the first half of the day and afternoons were filled with fun activities. A swim in the lake on the second day of camp and the gorge walk on the third day was quite an experience. The gorge walk took for us to walk up a cold stream, through stony, slippery rocks and rock pools and also picturesque views of the sholas surrounding us.

Staying in tents and thatched huts in the midst of the forest, sharing our accommodation with palm sized spiders and spiny caterpillars took us through a raw experience of the wild! Our torches and lanterns sure benefitted us more than we expected.

The last night of our stay at AVALANCHE, we treated ourselves to a lavish Barbecue spread with roasted delicacies! We enjoyed roasting potatoes and corn on hot coals at the camp fire.

Apart from all the adventure, we divided ourselves into teams and expressed ourselves by participating in competitive activities like skits and story-telling that were filled with humor and paralleled with Biblical concepts.

At our final session with Mr. George Ebenezer, we were taken through practical steps of setting our focus on Christ. We returned to Bangalore early on 2<sup>nd</sup> Nov 2010 enriched, blessed and encouraged.

The purpose of this camp was for us to be able to put to practice and live what we already know in our walk with God. Having done that, we returned achieving a spirit of UNITY and LOVE.

On behalf of the IMC MYF I'd like to thank each of you for upholding us in your prayer. Thank you for the financial support and guidance through it all. I'd also like to thank Mr. George Ebenezer and Rev. Paul Royappa for their time at camp and helping us learn and grow more in Him.

Our youth advisors John and Suha have been more than a support! Thank you for investing in us your time, your thought, your guidance. Yours in Christ,

# Story by TRANSFORMERS
